大澤山 どきるる日本書の寺である。
当社は、元和九年（一六二五）
徳川家康よりこの地を賜された
本門佛立宗が、新庄藩主を務めた
藝術家集いとしてある。

光悦は、刀剣鑄造ほか、書、陶器、
絵画、詩歌などにまれる才能を持ち、
者としても活躍した。
没後に、本法の日本上人開山に
請じて寺に改めたものである。

Kōshō-ji Temple
Kōshō-ji Temple, formerly named "Tokkyō-ji", is a temple of the Nichiren sect of Buddhism.
In 1619, having received land in this area from Tokugawa Ieyasu, the artist Horinji Kotatsu
settled here with his family and a group of artisans, and established the present temple.
He was a master of various arts, including calligraphy, ceramics, painting and mist-evasive decoration. He was also active
as a teacher of arts and crafts. This temple was originally a mortuary for the Horinji family
At the death of Ienaga, Kōshō-ji's head of Nembutsu Temple, was asked to consecrate the mortuary
by the deceased.
